Hello dear SMLC Family and friends!

How have you been these days?

"The night will soon be ending, the dawn cannot be far". This is Advent hymn # 337 in our hymnal, and it brings us HOPE. And this is what you and I need to keep: our hope and our faith that things will get better and that the darkness of the night cannot last forever. The pandemic we are experiencing for eight months now is literally making people "sick and tired". However, as a roaring storm that falls on our city, it may linger for a painful while but then it will eventually go away! The winds will calm down and the sun will shine again. Our Lord Jesus was not only present with his disciples in good times and sunny days, but he was also in the middle of the storm, the strong winds, the threatening waves.

In the words of Rev. Tim Teuscher, president of the Lutheran Church-Canada, who cited this same Advent hymn in his letter that you are invited to read in our website, "the Advent hymn proclaims to us in these uncertain and difficult times: "God dwells with us in darkness, and makes the light as day; yet we resist the brightness and turn from God away. But grace does not forsake us, however far we run. God claims us still as children through Mary's infant Son" (LSB 337:5).
